Here's how much a millennial needs to make to survive in Vancouver

We've read enough break-up letters to know that living in Vancouver is no easy feat – but how much does a person actually need to earn to live on the west coast?

If you're a millennial, the answer is **\$2,795.64 per month**.

According to a report compiled by insurance comparison site <u>LowestRates.ca</u>, the average millennial – described as those born between 1982 and 2004 – needs to earn about **\$40,000** before taxes (or **\$33,547.68** after taxes) annually "to make ends meet in Vancouver."

Here's the break-down:



- Housing \$1,929.67
- Phone and internet \$105
- Transportation \$133
- Groceries \$211.97

- Entertainment \$321
- Fitness \$75
- Insurance \$20

Those are just the "basics of a modern life," according to the report, and doesn't take into account monthly savings, student debt, travel and a number of other fun, cool things millennials might like to do.

And what about other Canadian cities? In Toronto, the approximate monthly take-home income required is \$2,740.48. In Montreal, that figure is \$2,003.60 and in Calgary, \$1,842.69.
